[In order to deepen the economic integration among East Asian countries, the Economic Research Institute of ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) has conducted a series of research projects to develop a Comprehensive Asia Development Plan (CADP) in response to the request from the East Asia Summit (EAS) Leaders. The CADP provides a grand spatial design for infrastructure development in East Asia, (ii) simulation analyses on the impacts of logistic enhancement to the region, using the Geographical Simulation Model (ERIA/IDE-GSM). Out of these outstanding issues, a study to develop a basic strategy to enhance the ASEAN-India connectivity is selected as one of the sub-project under phase 2 of the CADP. This session will present the Comprehensive Asia Development Plan (CADP) and salient features of emerging architecture of ASEAN-India Connectivity.]
