11.00 – 12.30 Session I: Sustainable Exploitation and Harnessing of Marine Resources

[Oceans cover two-thirds of the world's surface area and provide a substantial portion of the global population with food and livelihood. This session will offer insights into aspects related to sustainable harnessing of marine resources. Another focus-area of the session will be the use of technologies to facilitate the safe use of the oceans through the provision of oceanographic and hydrographic services and the use of space to aid in resource-mapping of the oceans. The session will highlight the potential of existing and emerging technologies that can be utilised to advance the sustainable use of marine resources and promote economic and social development through the efficient use of oceanic resources. Discussions will also focus on how to ensure the sustainability aspect of the Blue Economy, including through the application of practical and innovative approaches such as bio, circular and green economy. The session will aim to identify the specific activities that can be undertaken within this ambit, jointly by ASEAN and India.]

[This session will discuss challenges in combating marine debris. Marine debris threatens ecosystems, affects public health and negatively impacts fishery and tourism industries around the globe. Both ASEAN and India have a common aspiration to implement the United Nations 2030 Agenda for SustainableDevelopment, in particular to achieve SDG 14: Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development, and its target 14.1 which seeks to "prevent and significantly

reduce marine pollution of all kinds, in particular from land-based activities, including marine debris and nutrient pollution" by 2025. This session will discuss the challenges being faced by ASEAN and India in combating marine debris through cooperation.]

10.00 – 11.30 Session IV: Sustainable Maritime Connectivity

[The 'greening' of maritime connectivity is a critical facet of attaining and sustaining a transition to a regional Blue Economy. 'Green shipping' and 'green shipping corridors' are clearly transitions towards which ASEAN and India must cooperatively and collaboratively commit themselves, especially when noting that shipping activities also produce transboundary wastes. Likewise, smart ports that are resilient to the adverse impacts of climate change, transboundary pollution, smart ships, and green logistics, all offer very significant opportunities for the 'blueing' of regional economies. The maritime mediums in question (whether physical or digital) offer both opportunities and challenges that urgently need to be identified and explored through result-oriented processes and mechanisms. This session will endeavour to point the direction that ASEAN-India cooperation must take.]
